Summer fun for teenagers in grades 7, 8, 9! Come see old friends and make new ones!

Weekend Format...

NB weekends are usually held in a youth camp setting, where young Christians can “retreat” from their ever-hectic world to consider some of the important relationships in their lives—with parents, with siblings, with peers, and with their Lord.

Since relationships continually change, it is good for young people to attend several NB weekends—there is no limit to the number of weekends a 7-9th grader can attend.

The program begins on Friday night at 7:00pm and ends on Sunday afternoon at about 4:00pm. The NB weekend proceeds in a building block fashion, so participants must plan to attend the entire weekend.

A pair of youth leaders, called Shepherds, leads the entire weekend. These high school-aged young people guide the journey. The youth team is assisted by a married couple and spiritual director (clergy) and other adult leaders.

In addition to songs, games and skits, youth leaders present short talks on these topics: Friends, Siblings, Parents, School, What is Love?, Who is Jesus?, and The

Church. Small groups provide the opportunity to learn and share together.

What is New Beginnings?

- a fun, fast paced retreat weekend designed just for youth in the grades of 7-9.

- run by a team of motivated Christian youth dedicated to serving all on the weekend by living the gospel of Jesus Christ.

- a chance for youth to reflect on the important relationships in their lives and consider making a “New Beginning.”

- songs, snacks, skits, games, old friends and new friends.

A Spiritual Experience for Youth...

Even though NB is hosted in the Episcopal tradition, this experience is for all Christian youth. Episcopal youth are encouraged to invite their Christian friends to the weekend. NB is a great outing for an entire junior high youth group! Often, a NB weekend is the first opportunity for a young person to pause and reflect on their situation and their God.

NB presumes that participants will abide by the norms of a Christian community. All participants are expected to be respectful of the needs and rights of others. Use of any tobacco products, alcohol, or illegal drugs, inappropriate boy-girl behavior, or

destruction of property will not be tolerated. Those that cannot live within the norms will be asked to leave the weekend.

What about Adult Supervision?

Although the NB weekend is predominantly led by a youth leadership team, adult leaders are engaged throughout the entire weekend.

As a policy, NB requires each church that sends “New Beginners” to the weekend also provide one Adult Sponsor for each 5 youth attending (that are not on the team.) Exception: any church that has never sent a delegation to NB may send up to 3 youths to the weekend without an adult sponsor. A sponsor from the adult team staff will be appointed for those youth. All subsequent participation by that church will require sponsors.

What about the Cost?

The fee for all participants (first time guests and team alike) on this NB week is \$65. All meals starting Saturday morning thru Sunday noon are provided. In addition, healthy (and some not so healthy!) snacks are provided at appropriate times during the weekend.

Money should never be an obstacle to a youth wanting to attend a weekend. Scholarships are available—to apply for assistance, contact the NB Coordinators.
